Summary

I have practiced Gastroenterology as Consultant Gastroenterologist since 1982 and have performed about 16,000 gastroscopies, about 4000 colonoscopies and about 1000 ERCPs. I have taught in training courses in gastroscopy and colonoscopy. I have researched on various gastroenterological topics and published more than 200 scientific papers in peer-reviewed journals.

I am now retired from my substantive NHS post and from private practice.

I am co-author of the current British guidelines (Gut 2014; 63: 7-42) on Barrett's oesophagus and have published other papers on the subject. I was co-Lead of the British Society of Gastroenterology National Registry for Eosinophilic Oesophagitis.

I was a member of Rome 4 for the Rome Foundation from 2014 - 2016. This is an international organization dedicated to the study of functional gastrointestinal diseases and which publishes guidelines for various conditions adopted throughout the world. Just over 100 experts were involved in the production of Rome 4 guidelines.

Medico-legal experience

I have undertaken medico-legal work since 2000 and clinical negligence reports since 2014. I presently undertake approximately 40 reports per year. I do not have a waiting list and my turnaround time is approximately 4 weeks.
